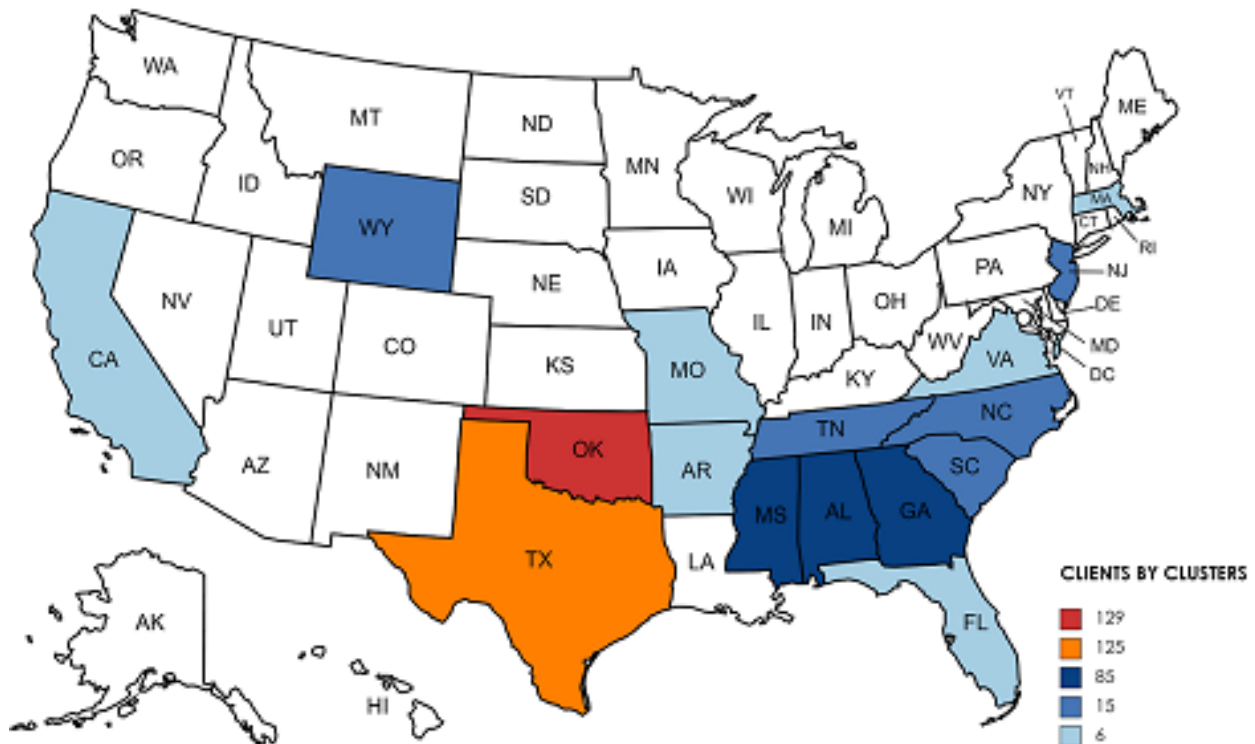

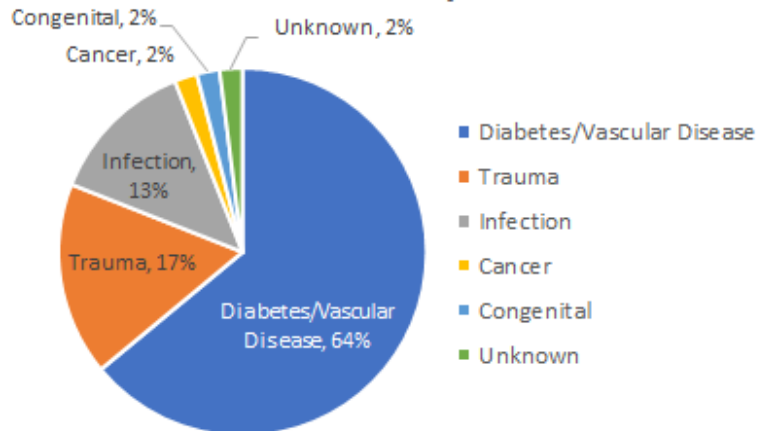

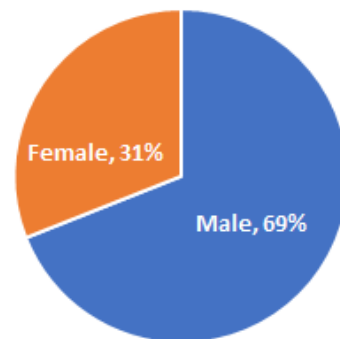

Client Demographics 2021

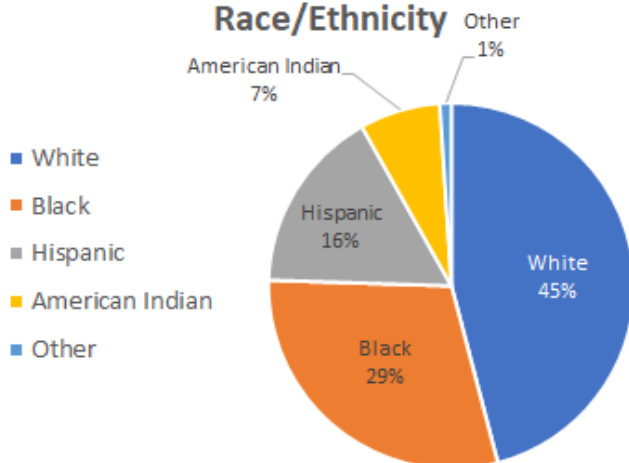
Cause of Amputation

Race/Ethnicity



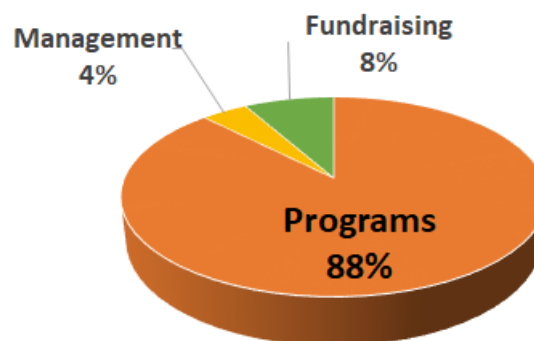
Client Income/National Poverty Level

- Average income of client served was 64% of the poverty level
- Household income of 90% of clients served was below 138% of the Federal Poverty Level (eligibility level for Medicaid)
- In 2021, Medicaid did not cover prosthetic care for those over 17 years of age in Oklahoma, Texas, Mississippi, Alabama or Georgia, home to 94% of Limbs for Life clients

### HOW WE SPEND EACH DOLLAR



In 2016, Limbs for Life was notified that it was named as a partial beneficiary of a generous Trust which continues distributions into 2022. LFL's beneficial interest in these assets was recognized as income of \$13,478,871 in 2017.

The Foundation has two goals regarding this tremendous gift:

- 1) Use funds to satisfy the mission – restoring lives by providing financial assistance to amputees that have no access to any other means to obtain a new prosthesis.
- 2) Invest a substantial portion of these distributions in income producing assets, enabling the Foundation to provide services well into the future.
